Will you watch out for people who need prayer?

Millions of Christians around the world are bullied and treated unfairly because they follow Jesus. Some live in countries where their leaders have made it illegal for Christians to meet together or have Bibles. Some have been forced to leave their home. Others live in places where they are treated badly by their neighbors, or where it is hard to go to school or get jobs.

They need people to look out for them! Open Doors does this by helping persecuted Christians with whatever they need. It could be special schools, secret Bibles, food, medicines or something else.

Above all, we let these Christians know that they are not forgotten, and that people all over the world are praying for them. And that's where YOU come in!

You can use this Prayer Passport to be a 'World Watcher.' Colossians 4:2 says, "Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful."

This prayer passport will help you to watch what is happening around the world, and pray for the Christians who are facing trouble because of their faith in Jesus. You can watch out for them on the TV and find out about them online. You can speak to people who have visited different places. And best of all, you can pray for them. Because even more than just watching the world, we can change the world through our prayers.

You may not know the Christians that you're praying for, but God does. He knows them and He loves them. And when you ask God to help them, He hears you.

Your prayers can change the world!

Each year, Open Doors ranks the countries where Christians are persecuted in the World Watch List. It's a table of the top 50 countries where Christians are in the most danger.


HOW TO USE YOUR PASSPORT AND MAP

HOW ARE CHRISTIAN CHILDREN PERSECUTED?

There are five main ways that Christian children face persecution:

- **Violence.** Children and their family members may be attacked, hurt or even killed for following Jesus.
- **Bullying.** Christian children may be bullied by other children in their school or community. Their whole family may face bullying, such as not being allowed to draw water from their village well.
- School problems. Some children are not allowed to go to school because they are Christian. Or perhaps they are allowed to go, but their teacher ignores them.
- Secret believers. Some children and their families must keep their faith completely secret. They may meet with other Christians secretly, keep their Bibles in a hidden place, or only pray silently.
- Losing their homes. Children and their families may have to run away from home to escape from people who want to attack Christians. Some have even had their homes burned down.

PERSECUTION

Persecution is when people are bullied, treated cruelly or even hurt because of their race or their beliefs. Christians, for example, are persecuted because they follow Jesus. They might be bullied, stopped from going to school or arrested and thrown into prison. They might even be attacked with guns and bombs.

1 NORTH KOREA



I PRAYED FOR:

Christians in North Korea must follow Jesus in secret. Everyone there is expected to treat the leaders of North Korea like gods, and anyone who believes in another God is seen as a criminal.

Christians who are discovered are arrested and might be killed. Amazingly, there are still thousands of secret Christians here.

Heavenly Father, thank you so much for the courageous Christians in North Korea.

DICTATOR

A dictator is someone who has complete control over a country. They use the police or army to control everyone, and everyone must do what they say. Even the television and news are under their control. Some dictators - like those in North Korea – come to power because they are part of a ruling family. Others take power by force, or by lying to the people. But anyone who speaks out against the dictator can be thrown into prison or even killed.

SOMETIMES CHRISTIANS HAVE TO BE...

Some children and their families must keep their faith completely secret.

When Sepideh* and her mother became Christians, they kept it a secret – even from Sepideh's father. They live in Iran, where it is illegal for anyone to leave Islam and follow another faith. "It's very difficult to make friends, because I cannot be who I really am," Sepideh says.

Sepideh's father has found out about her faith, and has threatened to report her and her mother to the police.

Please pray that God will give Sepideh's father a change of heart, and that he even might come to know Jesus himself.

Pray for Sepideh and other children around the world who are following Jesus in secret. Pray that God will protect them and help them to find safe ways to make friends with other believers. *Name has been changed to keep her safe*



2 SOMALIA



There are extremists in Somalia who think everyone should be a Muslim. If an

extremist finds a Christian, they may kill them right there and then. There are only a few hundred Christians in Somalia, and they have to follow Jesus in secret.

3 YEMEN

Christians in Yemen.

If a Muslim decides to become a Christian in Yemen, they can be arrested. New Christians often keep their faith a secret, and some Christians in Yemen don't know any other Christians there. But some Christians tell other people about Jesus, despite the risks, and the church in Yemen is growing. *Holy Spirit, please* be with the faithful

4 LIBYA

Criminal gangs run some parts of Libya, and some of these gangs are extremists who think everyone should be a Muslim. These groups will attack Christians and kidnap or kill them. A few Christians were recently arrested for telling others about Jesus in Libya – but their story actually made some people want to find out more about Christianity!



5 SUDAN

Christians in Sudan are often treated very badly. Christian women have been trapped in their homes like prisoners, and Christian men have been beaten up and even killed. Some Christians keep their faith so secret, they don't even tell their children about it.

6 ERITREA



Eritrea. Many are church leaders. They have been arrested because they want to do what God says, even when the government doesn't like it. They could be free if they would agree to stop following Jesus, but God gives them the courage to stand firm in their faith.

7 NIGERIA

Christians are often bullied and given the dirtiest jobs, like working in sewers or collecting rubbish. Some people make up lies about Christians to get them in trouble with the police. Despite being treated so cruelly, Pakistan's Christians are still choosing Jesus.

MUSLIM

A Muslim is someone who believes in Islam. Islam's founder was Muhammad. Muslims believe that there is only one God, called Allah. Most of the followers of Islam live in North Africa, the Middle East and

South and Central Asia. Islam is the second most popular religion in the world, after Christianity.

SOMETIMES CHRISTIANS FACE...

Christian children and their families may be bullied by others in their communities.

Julie* from Egypt faces bullying at school because of her faith in Jesus. Most of the other children in her class are Muslims, so they see her as different from them.


But Julie is overcoming her anxiety thanks to support from Open Doors partners. "I started to feel inner power to face hard situations," she says. "I learned to speak up and not be afraid because 'If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Romans 8:31)

9 IRAN

Dozens of Christians are in prison in Iran – many of them are church leaders.

This is because the leaders of Iran want everyone to be Muslims. Most Christians in Iran have to meet together secretly in their homes. Despite the risks, thousands of people in Iran have decided to follow Jesus.

Lord Jesus, I pray for the courageous Christians in Iran.

10 AFGHANISTAN

Christians in Afghanistan keep their faith secret, often meeting in the middle of the night. Afghanistan has been taken over by a group called the Taliban, who want everyone to be Muslims. If they find out that someone is a Christian, they might kill the Christian right there and then.

Holy Spirit, please be with the brave Christians in Afghanistan.





11 INDIA

In some parts of India, Christians are severely bullied – their neighbors might not let them use the village well to get water, or a doctor might not help them when they are sick. That's because extremists in India think that to be a proper Indian, you must be a Hindu. In some places, Christians have

been beaten up and even killed. *Heavenly Father, please look after the persecuted Christians in India.*



HINDU

A Hindu is someone who follows Hinduism. Hinduism started in India over 4,000 years ago. It's mainly followed in India – more than 80% of India's population are Hindu. The name 'Hindu' comes from the word 'Indus' – the main river in India. Hinduism is the world's third most popular religion.

SOMETIMES CHRISTIANS FACE... LOSING THEIR HOME

Sometimes Christian children and their families have to run away from home to escape from persecution. They may have to travel to another town, or even another country, to be safe.

Wenkun from Burkina Faso was just four when his family had to run for their lives. Their house, along with their entire village, was burned to the ground by Islamic extremists in early 2023. The family walked for three days before they found someone who would give them a lift. A pastor offered the family a piece of land to stay on, where they have built a simple shelter. Life is hard – they have to walk over a mile just to get water. But they are still trusting in God. Wenkun's father says, "We are displaced, but Jesus is not and will never be displaced from our lives. He is always with us."

Please pray for Wenkun and his family, and for the many other Christian families around the world who have lost their homes because of their faith. Ask God to provide for their needs, that they would be helped by their new communities and that the attacks would end.

12 SAUDI ARABIA



I PRAYED FOR:

If a Muslim from Saudia Arabia decides to become a Christian, they could be arrested or even killed if anyone finds out.

New Christians often keep their faith a secret. They may have to run away to another country to be safe if their faith is discovered.

Holy Spirit, please be with the hidden Christians in Saudia Arabia.

SECRET BELIEVERS

The name says it all: a secret believer is someone who has to keep their Christian beliefs hidden. In many countries on this list, Christians might be attacked or arrested if they are discovered. And so they keep their faith secret. They pray silently in their rooms. Sometimes they meet with other Christians but they make it look like they are just having a chat in a coffee shop with friends. They are really secret believers having a church service!



Most people in Myanmar are Buddhists. Myanmar is in the middle of a civil war, and the government think Christians are helping their enemies. Churches and Christian villages have been attacked and Christians have been killed. Some Christians had to leave the country to be safe.

15 CHINA

The Chinese government wants to control Christians. It tries to put cameras in churches to spy on them. It has also passed laws to make life hard for Christians – for example, children are not allowed to go to church. Some Christians prefer to meet in their houses so that they can't be spied on, but these house churches have been raided and church leaders have been arrested. *Lord Jesus, I pray for the faithful Christians in China.*





COMMUNISM

Communism is a form of government. The idea is that people should not own land or businesses, but that everything should be owned by the government. On the World Watch List, countries like Cuba, Vietnam, North Korea and China follow their own versions of Communism.



16 MALDIVES

Maldives want everyone to be a Muslim, so if a Muslim decides to become a Christian, they keep their faith completely secret. There are just a tiny number of Christians from the Maldives. Two people from the same family might have become Christians but not know about each other.



17 IRAQ

A few years ago, a group called Islamic State tried to take over Iraq. They killed Christians and destroyed their homes, and many Christians left Iraq. Now it is a bit safer, some Christians have started to come back. But Christians can still be treated unfairly by people who see them as different.

18 SYRIA



Christians in Syria are sometimes attacked by extremists who want everyone to be Muslims.

Some Christians have been kidnapped or killed. Many Christians left Syria when there was a civil war, but some have decided to stay to show the love of Jesus to others.

Lord Jesus, please remind Syrian Christians of the hope they have in You.

EXTREMISTS

An extremist is someone who holds extreme views, and who believes that it's OK to take illegal, violent, or other extreme action against anyone who thinks differently. So, religious extremists believe in taking extreme action against people who have different beliefs. For example, many Muslims want to live in peace. But some are Islamic extremists: they think it's OK to attack or bully anyone who is not a Muslim.



SOMETIMES CHRISTIANS FACE... VIOLENCE

Children and their family members may be attacked or even killed for following Jesus.

Preeti* lives with her grandparents in India. When her grandfather Ashok* became a Christian, he started holding prayer meetings in their house. But this angered some local Hindu extremists. Five or six attackers beat him with iron bars and wooden rods, and threw chilli powder in his eyes.



Preeti says, "I was feeling afraid. I was very angry at the people who did this to my family."

She asks us to pray for her family. Preeti says, "Pray for my family to grow in Christ. Pray that we should be safe to live out our faith "

19 ALGERIA

Most Christians in Algeria were brought up as Muslims, but later decided to follow Jesus. New Christians may keep their faith a secret, as some families become angry if someone stops following Islam. The government in Algeria has also made laws to make life difficult for Christians and shut many churches.

20 BURKINA FASO

Extremists in Burkina Faso want everyone to be Muslims. They have kidnapped and killed Christians and destroyed churches. Lots of Christians had to run away to save their lives. Some Christians are afraid to go to

church or send their children to school in case they are attacked. Holy Spirit, please help persecuted Christians in Burking Faso.



21 MOROCCO

Most people in Morocco are Muslims. If a Muslim decides to become a Christian, their life can become very difficult. They may be arrested by the police, or their family may kick them out of their home. The children of new Christians may be bullied at school. They are not allowed to meet together, so Christians meet in secret house churches.

REFUGEES/IDPS

Refugees are people who have been forced to leave their homes and go to another country. They are often driven from their homes by civil war or persecution. People who are forced from their homes, but stay somewhere else in the same country are called internally displaced persons (IDPs). Around the world, millions of refugees or IDPs live in tents in makeshift camps.

The government is suspicious of Christians because





in camps to be safe. Lord Jesus, I ask you to help the faithful Christians in CAR.





DISCRIMINATION

Discrimination means treating some people worse than others without any fair or proper reason. Some people are discriminated against because of their race or background. Christians may face discrimination simply because they follow Jesus.

SOME CHRISTIAN CHILDREN HAVE... SCHOOL PROBLEMS

Sometimes Christian children and their families have to run away from home to escape from their persecutors. They may have to travel to another town, or even another country, to be safe.

Benham was only a toddler when his house in Iraq was burned to the ground by extremists, and his family were



forced to run for their lives. Thousands of families had to do the same as extremists took over large parts of Iraq. Thankfully, a few years later, the extremists were forced out, and Benham and his family were able to return. They rebuilt their home with help from Open Doors partners.

> Please pray for Benham and other Christian families in Iraq who have been able to rebuild their homes. Pray that God will protect them, and help them not to fear being attacked again.



If a Muslim becomes a Christian, extremists can threaten to kill them.

34 TUNISIA

Most new Christians in Tunisia follow Jesus in secret, as it's against the law for a Muslim to change their religion. If their faith is discovered, they could be badly hurt or kicked out of their home. But our Tunisian brothers and sisters

have decided that following Jesus is worth the risks. *Holy Spirit, please be with the*

WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY ABOUT PERSECUTION?

Persecution is a normal part of being a Christian.

In John 15:20, Jesus told his followers, "If they persecuted me, they will persecute you also." (John 15:20). And in the In the New Testament, there are many stories of His we frequently see followers of Jesus being attacked, put in prison, and sometimes even killed (Acts 7:59-60; Acts 12:1-19; Acts 16:16-40). In 2 Timothy 3:12,

Paul – one of those followers – wrote, "Everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted." (2 Timothy 3:12). So people get persecuted for behaving like Jesus.

Have you ever had people get angry at you, when you were trying to do the right thing?

Persecution doesn't mean God doesn't love us.

Matthew 5:11-12 says "Blessed are you when people ... persecute you ... because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven." 'Blessed' means happy, deeply joyful, which sounds weird! How can people be deeply happy if they are persecuted? Perhaps the answer is because they also feel very close to God. In Romans 8, Paul asks, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution?" And his answer to his own question is – no! Nothing will be able to separate us from the love of God.

Have there been times when you felt Jesus very close to you?

We should pray for those who persecute us and forgive them.

Jesus also told His followers how to respond to persecution. He said In Matthew 5:44 Jesus says, "But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." (Matthew 5:44) And he doesn't didn't just say it – he does did it! Even when he was

dying on the cross, Jesus prayed for his persecutors, saying, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing" (Luke 23:34). If we hate people – even people who persecute Christians – then we are not behaving like Jesus.



THE ORIGINAL WORLD WATCHER: BROTHER ANDREW?

The original world watcher: Brother Andrew

A long time ago, in 1955, a man called Andrew grabbed his passport and started his adventures as a World Watcher.

The first place he visited was Poland. Andrew discovered that the Christians there were having a very hard time. They were not allowed to buy Bibles and some church leaders had been arrested. So he started smuggling Bibles to persecuted Christians all across Europe, driving thousands of miles in his little blue Volkswagen car.

As the years went by and Andrew kept watching, the world changed. The places in Europe where he had been smuggling Bibles started to become more free, and Christians were allowed Bibles again.

> But Andrew knew there were Christians in other parts of the world that needed help – and there were too many of them to help all on his own.

So he started the organization Open Doors to help persecuted Christians. In some places, that still means smuggling Bibles.

In other places, it can be hard for a Christian to get a job, so Open Doors might help them start a small



business. Sometimes Christians have to run away from home, so Open Doors might help them find somewhere safe to stay. Some Christians might need things like food and medicines.

And Open Doors also helps those persecuted Christians to know that they haven't been forgotten, and that people around the world are praying for them. That includes you!

There aren't many Christians in Comoros – almost evervone is a Muslim, Christians are not allowed to share their faith with Muslims. If they do, they could go to prison for a year. Muslims are also not allowed to leave Islam, so if they become Christians, they usually keep it a secret. Holy Spirit, thank you for the courageous Christians in Comoros.

IDEAS FOR PRAYER

Using your Prayer Passport is a great way to pray for persecuted Christians around the world. Maybe you could keep it by your bed and pray for a different country each night before you go to sleep.

Here are some other ideas to help you pray:

WATCH WHAT YOU EAT

Do you ever have food from other countries at school or with your family? If you're having food from India, China, Vietnam, Mexico or somewhere else on the World Watch List, take a moment at the start of the meal to pray for Christians from that country. You could pray with the other people who are eating, or just quietly to yourself.

WATCH CLOSELY

Pick a country from the World Watch List that you are going to watch especially closely this year. Look for stories about that country in the news, take out books about that country from the library, try some food from that country if you can find it. Perhaps you could even meet someone from that country, or talk to someone who has visited there. Most importantly, pray for that country every day.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

Take a walk around your neighborhood and let the things you see around you inspire your prayers for the world:

- See a lamppost? Pray that persecuted Christians will shine as lights for Jesus in their communities.
- See a bus stop or a train station? Pray for Christians who have had to travel far from their homes to be safe.
- See a school? Pray that Christian children will be able to get a good education.
- What other ideas can you think of?



46 COLOMBIA

Violent gangs have taken over parts of Colombia They hate it when Christians say that what they are doing is wrong. Gang members have killed church leaders. and abducted Christian children. Christians from communities that follow traditional religions also face bullying, and their children may not be allowed to go to school.

47 KYRGYZSTAN

If you become a Christian in Kyrgyzstan you could be locked up by your own family! That's because families and local communities think everyone should be a Muslim. So there is a lot of bullying and violence. Some Christians have even been forced to leave the places where they live.

Most people in Brunei are Muslims. There are some Christians in Brunei. but there are lots of rules about what they are allowed to do - for example, they are not allowed to celebrate Christmas where a Muslim could see it. If a Muslim decides to become a Christian, they often face bullying from their families.

HOUSE CHURCH

Many Christians around the world meet in houses or apartments. These are known as house churches. They might do all the same things that Christians do in church buildings sing songs, read the Bible, pray and learn together - but they do it at home. For the persecuted church house churches are a way of meeting together in secret, but they have to be careful in case the neighbors find out!

Many Christians have had their houses burnt down or destroyed in Chad by extremists who want everyone to be Muslims. They have lost their homes and had to find shelter somewhere else. Sometimes the attacks are so bad that Christians are too scared to go to church.

Churches in Jordan are watched closely by the government, as they don't want Christians to tell Muslims about Jesus. If a Muslim decides to become a Christian, they may be bullied by their family or neighbors. A new Christian might find it hard to get a job, or they could even be arrested or beaten up.
